- Friday, April 5, National Semifinals; 7 and 9:30 p.m. ET (ESPN).
- Sunday, April 7, National Championship; 3 p.m. ET (ABC).

**VENUE:** Rocket Mortgage FieldHouse, Cleveland, Ohio. Seating capacity: 18,063.

**HOSTS:** Mid-American Conference and Greater Cleveland Sports Commission.

TELEVISION BROADCAST: For the 21st consecutive year, an ABC/ESPN channel will broadcast all games of the 2024 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship. This marks the 29th straight year (since 1996) that ESPN is the championship's exclusive television home. The 2024 NCAA Women's Final Four will be an ESPN MegaCast, airing on ABC, ESPN, ESPN2 and ESPNU and will also be available online via the ESPN App. The Women's Final Four is expected to be distributed to over 200 countries internationally.

RADIO BROADCAST: NCAA Radio Network coverage of the championship has included as many as 234 affiliate stations in the top markets nationwide, including a simulcast on SiriusXM Satellite Radio.

## **Celebrating History**

2024 will mark the 42nd anniversary year of NCAA women's championships as the NCAA celebrates its 118th year as an Association.

#### By the Numbers

- 1 Number of schools from the State of Ohio that have participated to date in the Women's Final Four. Ohio State advanced to the national championship game in 1993, losing to Texas Tech in the title game.
- **2** The 2024 Women's Final Four in Cleveland will mark the second time that the city has played host to America's marquee women's sporting event, hosting previously in 2007. That year, Tennessee and legendary head coach Pat Summitt claimed the seventh of eight national championships won by the Lady Vols, defeating Rutgers in the title game, with LSU and North Carolina also participating that year.
- 16 In the 41 previous Women's Final Four's going into 2024, 16 different schools have captured the national championship, led by UConn with 11 titles. LSU enters the season as the defending national champion, winning its first national title at the 2023 Women's Final Four in Dallas.
- **9.9 million** The 2023 national championship game on ABC between LSU and lowa drew 9.9 million viewers, making it the most-viewed women's college basketball game and ESPN platforms' most-viewed college basketball game (men's or women's) on record.

**8,998,194**— Number of fans that have attended NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship games over the past 41 years, with the nine millionth fan to pass through the turnstiles in 2024.
