Wolf Run Golf Club was conceived in the early 1980's by the late Dr. Jack Leer, a local dentist and successful amateur golfer whose dream was to build a demanding, world-class golf club for serious golfers.

The golf course is as diverse as its scenery, yet tests every facet of the player's ability. With narrow fairways and firm, fast greens surrounded by dramatic and strategic bunkering, players quickly realize that all the shots are required to play Wolf Run. As a result, Wolf Run is a thinking man's course, where a player at the top of his game would be offered strategic and at times heroic options on every hole.

Wolf Run is one of the Midwest's best kept secrets. There are few places that offer beauty and uniqueness while testing the player to his highest capabilities. There is no doubt that Wolf Run is a special place. "Wolf Run is not for every golfer, it's only for those who respect the game's traditions and who appreciate what refined shot-making entails," Bradley Klein, Golfweek Magazine.

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EVACUATION PLAN

In the event play is suspended, first and foremost is the safe evacuation of players and spectators from the golf course in a timely manner.

Shelters are also available around #3 Green and #13 Tee.

Vans will be stationed in these locations throughout the event. Our first priority will be to get the players and then we will go back for spectators.

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DRUG TESTING

Student-athletes who compete in this regional may be subjected to drug testing in accordance with bylaws 18.4.1.5 and 31.2.3 and may be determined to be ineligible as a result thereof.

EQUIPMENT

The type of equipment (i.e. balls and clubs) to be used shall be determined by the individual team and must be acceptable under USGA rules. The one-ball rule (brand) will be in effect. Golf bags must have the name or logo of the school on them.

Players and coaches will be required to use soft-spike shoes during the regional competition. This includes all practice rounds. Penalty for breach of this condition is two strokes per hole with a maximum of four strokes. As soon as the breach has been discovered, the player must immediately make the appropriate changes to conform to the policy. Range finders may be used during practice and competition rounds. Other electronic devices are prohibited on the days of competition. Ringers on electronic devices must be turned off. Exception: electronic devices may be used by the coaching staff to monitor live scoring. Earphones are not permitted to be used when monitoring live scoring.

GOLF CARTS

Golf carts will be provided for members of the games committee and selected tournament officials. Only two people may ride in the cart at one time. Exceptions must be approved by the games committee.

Participants may not use caddies, golf carts or motorized pull carts during competition. The only exception to this policy would be if the participant is permanently disabled. A written request must be submitted to the appropriate games committee with the accompanying medical statements requesting the use of a cart. Please confirm with the NCAA national office as there may be exceptions on file for the duration of a student-athlete's career.

HOSPITALITY

Four tents will be located on the course for athlete hospitality. Fruit, snacks, bottled water, and sport drink will be provided for participants, coaches, committee members and volunteers. Box lunches can be ordered each day. Coaches may pick up groups of lunches at the clubhouse if they wish. **Embassy Suites Hotel will have a hospitality room each night of the tournament located in the Board Room.**

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LINE-UPS AND SUBSTITUTIONS

During registration, the head coach must submit his or her line-up according to playing position. The five contestants from each institution must be determined by the conclusion of registration. A player may be substituted before the first tee time of his team of the first round of the regional or championships, if the head coach notifies the games committee before the first tee time. The substitute must assume the position of the replaced player.

LODGING

The Embassy Suites Indianapolis North will serve as the host hotel for this tournament. Room blocks are being held for NCAA officials, coaches, teams, and qualifying individuals. Teams must contact Krista Kindler to secure your room reservations. The room blocks will be filled on a first-call first-served basis. Teams choosing not to stay at Embassy Suites must obtain a written release from Krista Kindler. Please fill out the rooming list form in the back of this manual. Please contact Krista by phone (317-715-4906) to reserve your rooms and then e-mail your rooming list to her at Krista.kindler@hilton.com. Please note; the cut-off date for the rooming list is **Friday, May 13th at 5:00 p.m. ET.**

The charge for the host hotel will be \$109 per room per night and will include a hot breakfast. Breakfast will be served daily from 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m.

A hospitality room will be available from 8:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. each night at the Embassy Suites. Complementary snacks and beverages will be served. This hospitality room is open to all coaches and officials only.

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OFFICIALS

Representatives of the Division I Men's Golf Committee present at the various championships along with specified rules officials will make all decisions pertaining to the conduct of the championship, such as pairings and golf course set up.

The sport committees have made arrangements for Golf Stat to provide the computerized scoring system for the tournament.

PAIRINGS AND STARTING TIMES

Both first and tenth tees will be used for the entire competition. The committee reserves the right to use only the first tee, or mini-groups if necessary. Tee-times will not be altered to accommodate travel schedules.

After all teams and individuals have been selected, the NCAA Division I Men's Golf Committee will assign pairings and tee-times for the first round based on seed within each region. For the second and third round, teams and individuals will be paired according to score. Pairings and tee-times will be announced after selection. See Appendix A for a list of practice and competition tee times.

PARKING

There will be areas of reserved parking for the participating teams, officials and committee members. Spectators will be able to park in a lot adjacent to the golf course.

POST-COMPETITION INTERVIEWS

Post-competition interviews will be conducted immediately after the 10 minute cooling down period and interviews will be open to all certified members of the news media. The interview area will be located in the Wolf Run clubhouse. Any coach and student-athlete requested by the media will be available for interviews. If a team or individual is participating in an awards ceremony, the cooling off period shall begin immediately after the presentation. Representatives of the media should direct interview requests to Doak Henry.

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MAY 19TH THROUGH MAY 21st

PRACTICE ROUND

One 18 hole practice round will be scheduled before the regional tournaments and championships finals. Starting 10 days before the first practice round, participants and coaches will not be permitted to set foot on the golf course or use practice facilities. No exceptions will be made; however, the host institution's team shall be exempt from this policy.

In an effort to maintain the conditions of the course and speed of play, each player may play only one ball during any practice round, except each player may chip or putt more than one ball on or near the green only.

Teams are limited to five players during practice rounds. Groups of six are not allowed, and coaches are not allowed to play during any practice round.

Head coaches or designated official institutional representatives will be required to be with their teams during the entire practice rounds. Coaches will be provided time schedules and be responsible for monitoring pace of play, misconduct and the enforcement of the one practice-ball rule. If a team falls out of position during the practice round the first offense is a warning. Should a team remain out of position a second time the team will be moved to the proper position on the golf course. Further offenses may result in the team being removed from the golf course for the remainder of the practice round.

Practice-round pairing and tee times at the regional will be determined by seed, and assigned by the golf committee as set forth in Appendixes C and D in the championships handbook.

In addition to the practice policies above, the following will be enforced for the regional and championships:

- 1. Only credentialed, designated individuals may be allowed in the practice areas.
- 2. Teams may not start a practice round other than during its designated time or position.
- 3. Players may not go back on the course to practice after concluding each round.
- 4. Players and coaches are permitted on the course, starting with the beginning of the first practice day and throughout the championships, as a spectator.

REGISTRATION

Registration will take place at the Embassy Suites on Tuesday, May 17th from 2:00 p.m. to 6:00 p.m. Championship packets will be distributed at this time and line-ups must be submitted.

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RESTROOMS

Restrooms are located at the clubhouse, between holes 3 and 8, near the shelter on hole 13, and to the right of hole 14.

RESULTS

Results, pairings and starting times will be located at the front desk of the Embassy Suites, the Wolf Run Clubhouse and www.ncaa.com.

RECEPTION AND RULES MEETING

A cookout for all participants, coaches, and administrators will be held on Wednesday, May 18th at 3:00pm around the Wolf Run Clubhouse.

The **mandatory** rules meeting will begin at 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, May 18th in the Barcelona C and D rooms of Embassy Suites Hotel. The games committee will conduct a pre-tournament meeting to review tournament procedures, local rules and items of importance to intercollegiate golf. For the regional championship, Head Coaches are **required** to attend.

SPORTS MEDICINE

Athletic trainers will be available at the course beginning one hour prior to competition as well as during competition. A physician will be on call during the tournament. Sports medicine will be located inside the clubhouse. Please contact Joe Lueken at 812-345-1653 or jlueken@indiana.edu should you have any needs.

SCORING

Scorecards shall be kept in strict accordance with rule 6-6 of the USGA's "Scoring the Stroke Play" and shall be returned promptly upon completion of play. The scorecard shall be deemed returned to the golf committee when it is placed by the player or coach in the box located by the scoring area.

A daily team score is computed by totaling the lowest scores of the four out of five team members. The final team score is determined by totaling each daily score.

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SPECTATORS

Spectators must remain on cart paths or in the rough and approximately 15 yards from the players at all times. This rule includes all designated practice areas. There may be NO communication between players and spectators that could be deemed as advice of any nature for the duration of the round. All institutional personnel, with exception to designated coaches, are considered spectators. Ringers or notifications on electronic devices must be turned off. Cameras and video recording devices are not allowed on the course during competition.

Since all NCAA championships are smoke-free, spectators will be asked to refrain from smoking unless in designated areas. Failure to adhere to this rule will be grounds for removal from the course.

Carts will not be available to spectators. Disabled spectators may appeal to this rule through the NCAA. Final decision will be at NCAA's discretion. Viewing areas for disabled spectators will be made available by Wolf Run Golf Course. Host volunteers will be able to help transport spectators to these areas.

The Men's Golf Committee recognizes the unique circumstance surrounding a disabled parent's opportunity to see his/her student-athlete compete. Golf carts may be available to parents under the following protocols:

- Parent of player only
- Requests must be submitted no later than Monday, May 16th to Kit Klingelhoffer at cklingle@indiana.edu or 812-855-0847
- Each request will be submitted to the Division I Men's Golf Committee for approval. A
 physician's slip will be required.
- If the committee approves this request, a volunteer will drive the cart around the course.

SUSPENSION OF PLAY

The games committee will do everything possible to complete 54 holes by Saturday, May 21st. If a minimum of 36 holes cannot be completed, the games committee will select the regional representatives to the finals taking into considerations 18 hole scores and other selection criteria.

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TOBACCO BAN

The use of tobacco products by any individual on the golf course as well as during other championship activities is prohibited. The appropriate sports committee in accordance with the misconduct provisions of bylaw 31.1.10 shall deal with the violations of this policy.

TICKETS

Admission is free to all days of this tournament.

UNIFORMS

Competitors must wear uniforms of the same color during all rounds, this includes the practice round. Walking or Bermuda shorts are permitted provided they are team shorts and are of similar color. The inseam of the shorts must be at least four inches. Players may wear slacks or shorts at the individual's discretion, provided they are of similar color and are considered a team uniform.

VIDEOTAPING AND STILL PHOTOGRAPHY

Institutions are permitted to videotape championship competition by their teams or their individual student-athletes for archival, coaching or instructional purposes. Each institution may use one camera. The film may not be used for any commercial reasons.
